TOP 12 STATES THREATENED BY EPA'S OZONE RULE


The Environmental Protection Agency is expected to propose draconian cuts in ozone levels that will destroy jobs across the country.

Nontatiniment areas are indicated by color. Mentody a portion of a county is shown in color. I indicates that only that part of the county is swithin a nonstainiment area boundary. Here are the states that could face penalties under EPA's expected standard:

Here's how the proposed ozone regulations would affect some of our biggest states:


